

April 1466

The woman was on her knees, praying as she had been since just before dawn: praying, praying, and praying still more for **deliverance** from her awful fate. Her hooded eyes, set deeply in a long face framed by straight brown hair, were tightly closed. Her thin lips moved soundlessly. She was young, barely past her fifteenth birthday. The **wan** afternoon light streaming in through the narrow, arrow-slit windows barely **illuminated** the dimness

within, joining flickering candlelight in casting the room's lone occupant in darkness.

She shifted uncomfortably on her aching knees and licked her dry, parched lips. The arid cold of April in the heart of Castile drifted into the silent chapel, its thick stone walls muffling the sounds from the **bustling** castle that surrounded it, and left her shivering.

A powerful man, one of the most important nobles in Castile, was on his way to the city of Madrid. Pedro Girón intended to marry the young woman, and he was bringing three thousand men with him to ensure that the wedding happened as planned.

The young woman had not been consulted in the matter.

But she was no pawn. Her name was Isabella, and she was a princess of Castile, third in line to the throne, and half sister of King Enrique IV. Not coincidentally, Enrique had arranged for her marriage to Girón in return for his support in a particularly nasty and ongoing civil war. Isabella had no intention of serving as the unwilling mortar cementing an alliance that in no way furthered her own political interests, marrying a Castilian nobleman aligned with her feckless half brother Enrique. She knew what her future could be, up to and including sitting on the throne of Castile in her own right. Isabella had no army in Madrid, but that did not mean she was without weapons. To her, prayer was as dangerous as any corps of mercenary knights. May God strike Girón dead, she pleaded. Either Girón, or her. Either way, she would not marry him.

The afternoon light faded. As total darkness fell on the chapel, plunging the cloth-draped altar and its depictions of the Virgin into deepening shadow, Isabella rose from her aching knees. Breathing in the cool, **desiccated** air of the Castilian *meseta*, she offered one more prayer, hoping God had heard it.

Several weeks later, a messenger arrived, his horse thundering into the courtyard of the castle. Girón was dead, he said. The nobleman had died on

the road shortly after leaving his stronghold. Isabella has prayed, and God had listened.

For Isabella, princess and later queen of Castile, prayer was a statement of her **agency** and provided "a victory wrested from fortune by patience and **fortitude**." She grew to adulthood surrounded by men who intended to use her for their own political purposes. In the end, she bent them all—Enrique IV, her eventual husband Ferdinand of Aragon, popes, and innumerable lesser figures alike—to her will.
