

Principal's Statement

I would like to take this opportunity to wish everyone a happy and blessed new year. 2024 has brought us many blessings and new opportunities for our school families. We have welcomed new members to both our parish and school. It has been an exciting year with accomplishments that are beyond what we could have envisioned. I would like to thank our families, teachers, staff, advisory council, priests, PTC, and our students for making these accomplishments possible. These many accomplishments were recognized this past September when we held our accreditation visit which only happens once every seven years. The hard work and dedication of many was highlighted by the accreditation team and has led to the next phase in our OLV journey.

Over the past few weeks, we broke ground on a junior high that will offer opportunities for generations to come. Our community has come together to raise more than 3.1 million dollars in pledges for this project. We'd like to thank our donors and volunteers for their commitment to this project all while still giving and contributing to our usual school fundraisers. This past year, we were able to replace all 4 major A/C units in the cafeteria, and we were able to double our financial aid fund for families in need. Your generosity not only helps transform our campus, but it helps bring down OLV's actual cost to educate. This past year, we were able to educate students for around \$7000/student which is nearly half that of the public school system. Due to the rising cost of insurance, goods, services, and educational tools, our diocese has notified us again of anticipated large financial increases to our schools. As we near the end of the year, if you have cause that you would still like to contribute to our annual fund, adopt-a-student, and JH campaign, we are still in need of funds.

SAFETY UPDATES

Dismissal Changes

As required by our recent accreditation, we will be taking steps to further enhance safety in our parking lots.

Please see the important changes for semester 2 below:

Gym Lot:

- Morning Drop Off- No Change, we Strongly Encourage families to use our drop off lane rather than the park and walk method.
- Afternoon Pick up (3:20) All families 5-8th are required to stay in their car and use the Lane 2 Pick up line furthest away from the gym. A Cone will be placed in Lane 2 at 3:30 promptly so we can efficiently dismiss 1st 4th in lane 1 at 3:30.
- Afternoon Pick Up (3:30) All Families 1st 4th are required to stay in their car and use the Lane 1 Pick up line Closest to the gym. Those families with someone in the ECC or aftercare should still pick up in the mesquite lot.

Mesquite Lot: No Changes

Both Lots: Families are required to use our Car-tags or IDs upon every pick up from school both during school hours and at dismissal. If you need extra car tags, please contact the office.

Benchmark 1.4 The Commission concurs with the self-study and the visiting team that the addition of the religion coordinator has been an asset to the religion program. This position helps coordinate special spiritual formation events and student ministries, collaborates with teachers to integrate religion into all subject areas, as well as supports the vertical alignment of the religion program.

Benchmark 2.8 The Commission commends the school on their strong and supportive leadership. Staff members stated the administration is visible and present throughout the school day. Staff also stated they felt supported by administrators when a need arises. The visiting team concurs with the statements from the interviews, as it aligns with what was observed.

Benchmark 3.4 The Commission commends the school for their differentiation to meet student individual learning needs. Utilizing staff interventionists, specialists, tutors, advanced classes, and small group instruction, all students are afforded the opportunity for academic support and enrichment activities.

Benchmark 3.2 The Commission commends the school for its implementation of the uniformed Common Curriculum Platform for lesson planning. The Common Curriculum Platform allows for consistent formatting across all grade levels. It includes TEKS, procedures, homework, accommodations, and modifications.

Benchmark 4.2 The Commission agrees with the visiting team in commending the school for adding support staff and utilizing title resources for additional services including a counselor, dean of students, safety coordinator, interventionist, speech therapist, and test proctor. The school continues to focus on supporting students as much as possible.

Benchmark 5.1 The Commission agrees with the visiting team and self-study and commends the school on their installation of panic buttons and security cameras throughout the campus, as well as the addition of a full-time safety coordinator who has a strong presence on campus.

Benchmarks 5.2 & 5.3 The Commission commends the school's vision for future expansion of a new junior high facility. This facility will decrease shared spaces between teachers, allow for fluid transitions, and meet the needs of the junior high students. The expansion will allow more classrooms per grade level, expanded class offerings, and additional room for future growth.

Benchmark 5.2 The Commission recommends the school evaluate current arrival and dismissal practices and procedures and implement additional safety protocols for both arrival and dismissal areas. The visiting team observed students traveling through parking lots without faculty escorts and limited accountability of students throughout both arrival and dismissal areas.
